## Shaping community services for the future: Options for care in Bovey Tracey

MANY OF you will be aware that Torbay and Southern Devon Health and Care NHS Trust, the organisation who provides health services across Southern Devon and health and social care in Torbay is currently running a public consultation called Shaping Community Services.

The consultation, which started on 29 November and runs until 24 February 2013, aims to get the views of local people on proposals to relocate inpatient services from Bovey Tracey Community Hospital and Ashburton and Buckfastleigh Community Hospital to the state of the art and purpose built Community Hospital in Newton Abbot. As part of the consultation they are also asking local people what new services they would like to see brought to the community in the vacated hospital space.

Since the start of the consultation residents have been able to share their thoughts and views on the proposals online, by completing and return a freepost leaflet that is available in GP surgeries, libraries or children's centres , or by attending one of the public meetings that was held in January and early February. Further, local residents should have or will soon receive a leaflet through their doors to complete and return via a Freepost address.

## Community Path

WORK CONTINUES by Devon County Council to progress the Wray Valley Trail a community path between Moretonhampstead and Bovey Tracey. Phase one of the scheme between Pound Lane, Moretonhampstead and Steward Wood was completed in April 2011. Phase two of the scheme in Bovey Tracey from Station Road, through Mill Marsh Park to the A382 at Hole Bridge is well underway and the Contractor, E&JW Glendinnings of Ashburton is on schedule despite adverse weather conditions throughout.

A new underpass below the A382 at Hole Bridge has already been constructed to provide a safe crossing from Mill Marsh Park to Parke, along with a new parking lay-by and connecting footpath on the A382. The existing pedestrian crossing over the A382 is being improved for use when the River Bovey is in flood. Good progress is being made installing the path through Mill Marsh Park.

Phase three of the trail will see maintenance works take place on the existing permissive path open through the Parke estate from Hole Bridge to Wilford Bridge that once formed part of the dismantled Moretonhampstead branch line. As well as work to maintain the existing surface the existing drainage will be cleared to improve any wet areas. Phases two and three are planned to be opened together at the end of March.

### 2013 Precept - £188,855

AFTER CAREFUL consideration, at its meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> January 2013, the Town Council set its precept for the next twelve months starting on 1st April 2013.

The precept is the amount of money required by the Town Council to undertake various services on behalf of residents. These include the maintenance and management of Mill Marsh Park, the Town Hall, play areas, allotments, the cemetery and other open spaces within the parish. The Town Council also financially supports the work of Bovey Tracey Youth Café and Heathfield Youth Club as well as providing a significant contribution to the Christmas lights and Bovey Tracey in Bloom. Due to continuing strong and effective financial management by the Town Council, we have been able to maintain the precept at £188,855 for the next financial year.

As you are probably aware, the Town Council is proposing to now build a new community building on the Old Thatched Inn site. A progress report on the plans for the new building is provided separately within this edition of Quality Update. As happened last year, £40,000 of the precept is being specifically allocated towards the building cost of the new building.

## Heathfield Community Centre

HEATHFIELD COMMUNITY CENTRE at Cannon Road, Heathfield, is available as a venue for activities, events, meetings and family parties.

On the ground floor is a hall, kitchen and small room for hire, whilst upstairs there is an area with its own kitchen, to which there is access by stairs or lift and is suitable for conferences, meetings etc. There is ample parking outside for more than 20 cars.

The centre is run by a small group of volunteers who would like to invite more members of the community to help them keep the centre open. We are looking for people to join the committee, carry out maintenance, organise activities and to generally support the centre. ### Old Thatched Inn Update

AS REPORTED in the last edition of Quality Update, the decision was taken by Councillors at its Council Meeting on 17<sup>th</sup> September 2012 not to progress the original option of rebuilding the Old Thatched Inn, but to demolish the existing structures and replace with a new single storey building. The Town Council further decided to apply to English Heritage to have the site de-listed as it is felt the remaining structures, the three stone walls adjacent to the highway, have no architectural or historical interest. English Heritage has agreed the remaining cob built section can be demolished.

The Town Council has now finalised the design of the proposed new building and is currently working with the Planning Department at Teignbridge District Council to ensure the design approved by the Town Council is acceptable in planning terms. Once this matter has been resolved there will be a public exhibition of the plans in the Town Hall. The date of the exhibition will be widely publicised.

## Community Land Update

THE RESULTS of the consultation undertaken by Bovey Tracey Town Council (BTTC) on possible future uses of the Community Land off the Le Moly-Litry Way, facilitated by the Community Council of Devon were received in December and are available for public viewing at [www.boveytracey.gov.uk](http://www.boveytracey.gov.uk).

BTTC is still waiting for the results of the hydrographical study of the area, which will soon be available to the Town Council following some additional work being undertaken as requested by the Environment Agency. Data gained from this study will be used by the Environment Agency to assess the viability of this site for future possible uses.

Once this information has been received, and taking the consultation results into consideration, the Town Council will then be in a position to consider what next steps to take regarding the future of the Community Land.

On behalf of the Town Council, Town Mayor Cllr Anna Klinkenberg would like to thank all those who attended the public event at the Methodist Hall last October and who returned their completed survey forms for their interest and involvement in this community-wide consultation.

### Mill Marsh Park

AS WIDELY reported in the media, the rain on late Saturday evening early Sunday morning on 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> November 2012, caused wide spread flooding throughout Devon. Whereas Bovey Tracey was not affected by flooding as bad as other areas locally, the River Bovey did overflow into Mill Marsh Park, which resulted in the play area being completely flooded.

The force of the water as it entered and left the play area caused some of the black safety surfaces in the play area to be lifted and disturbed the stone base on which these surfaces are laid. This has resulted in a lot of damage with four sections of the matting having to be replaced. Therefore, as this damage was classified as a Health & Safety issue, the Town Council was advised to close the play area.

Fortunately, the Town Council's insurance policy covers this type of damage. The insurance loss-adjusters have now agreed to the costs of undertaking the repair work, which, if weather conditions allow, will mean the play area should re-open in early March.
