Dog Ban



As reported previously, the Town Council has major concerns regarding the increase in dogs' mess not being picked up by irresponsible dog owners at the Recreation Ground in Newton

Road, despite there being six dog bins available. At its council meeting in January, the Town Council decided to give those people who walk their dogs at the Recreation Ground a further 10 week period to try to encourage all dog walkers to pick up their dog's mess. Regretfully the situation has not improved and the irresponsible minority have spoiled it for those people who do take the trouble to pick up their dog's mess.

At its meeting in March, the Town Council unanimously took the regrettable decision to implement a dog ban for the Recreation Ground from 1st June 2011. Obviously a lot of people will be upset over this decision. However, something has to be done to ensure no one is at risk, particularly young people, from contracting, *Toxocora* through contact with dogs' faeces. The open area of the Recreation Ground is used every week by either the cricket or football clubs for matches or training. Both clubs have very popular youth sections.

The proposed dog ban only relates to the Recreation Ground. There are many alternative places for local people to walk their dogs in and around Bovey Tracey. The Town Council has to take its Health & Safety responsibilities seriously in relation to the possible transmission of *Toxocora*.

Notices are to be placed out at the Recreation Ground informing dog walkers of the proposed ban. Town Council staff will also be regularly visiting the Recreation Ground, especially in the early morning, as this seems the time of day that those people who do not pick up their dog's mess exercise their dogs. All Councillors are happy to be contacted about this proposal and will gladly listen to any suggestions people may have. The contact details of the current councillors until the elections on 5th May are given overleaf.

As a footnote, during the four public consultation events that have been held regarding planning for the next 20 years for the parish, many people, young and old, said it would be wonderful to have at least one dog free area in the Parish, where residents could be confident they could enjoy using an area without the worry of encountering dogs mess. Recently, dog mess was found in the play area at the Recreation Ground, where dogs are certainly not allowed!

Heathfield Big Park & Youth Centre Update

Following the upgrading of Big Park during 2010, which the Town Council, along with other grants from different organisations in the Parish, invested £67,000 towards these improvements. Teignbridge District Council (TDC) invested £33,000 towards the project. It is fair to say that if the Town Council had not been proactive in offering this financial investment to TDC, the works to Big Park would have not been undertaken. The Town Council are still considering, financial resources allowing, whether to take over the responsibility for Big Park's future maintenance.

It has now been confirmed by Devon Youth Services (DYS) that the Youth Centre on Cannon Road will continue to operate for the foreseeable future despite a reduction in DYS's budget for 2011/12.



St Catherine's Update

St. Catherine's C of E Nursery and Primary School in Heathfield is a school that has shown that in a short space of time it is possible to achieve plenty for the benefit of the children and local community alike.

In the summer of 2010, St. Catherine's was given support from St. Michael's C of E Primary in Kingsteignton. This support was put in place to help the school during a difficult period. The head teacher, Jill Murch, then left to get married and the governors agreed to go into management partnership with St. Michael's.

This partnership working began in September 2010 with Adrian Clements as the new Head of Teaching and Learning and Martin Harding (Headteacher of St. Michael's) as the Executive Headteacher for both schools. Adrian's role involves being the head of the school and the day-to-day face of the school for the children, parents and local community.

The governors of St. Catherine's and St. Michael's have now agreed to become a Federation. Basically this means that the links between the schools that have been in place since September are now more formal. This link will include the creation of one federated governing body that will run both schools as of 27th April 2011, under the new federation name of the **United Schools Federation**, (USF) and its motto will be 'Aiming Higher, Achieving More, Together'.

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
